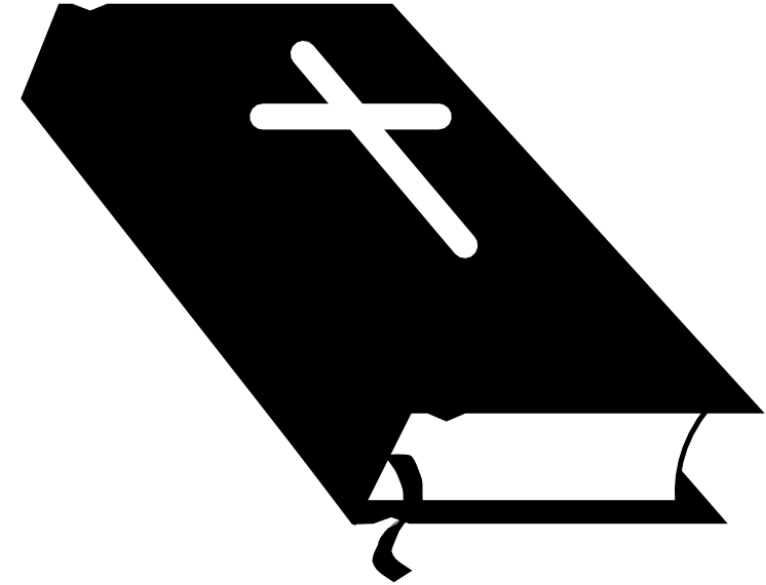

LEVITICUS

There are many genres of literature contained in the books of the Bible. Leviticus is primarily a book of worship instructions. As the people of Israel prepare to enter in to the promised land, Leviticus provides them with instructions on how to set things apart, how to make them holy. There are instructions for setting apart items used for worship, people who lead worship, times for worship, and even the people of Israel themselves.

NUMBERS

Numbers begins with a census—this counting of the people provides the means for starting to enter into the promised land. The census determines how many people are able to be a part of the Israelite fighting for, as well as how to divide the land once they enter into it.

DEUTERONOMY

Deuteronomy is a Greek word that means “Second Law.” As Moses prepares to die, he recounts the events of the Exodus, the laws that God gave to the people at Sinai, and all wilderness wandering that has led them to this point. The book closes with Moses’ blessing on the people as they prepare to enter into the promised land.

Each day as you read, it is helpful to reflect on four questions. There is space on the pages that follow for these questions, and for any other notes you may want to take as you read this week.

JOSHUA
